Community and School

The City of Staunton is located in the scenic Shenandoah Valley at the crossroads of interstate 81 and 64. It is 15 miles from Waynesboro City, 29 miles from Harrisonburg City, 40 miles from Charlottesville City, 108 miles from Richmond City and 157 miles from Washington D.C. Staunton has a population of more than 24,000. The area is economically driven through agriculture, commerce, tourism, and educational institutions. Staunton City Schools includes one high school, one middle school and three elementary schools. Staunton High School is a comprehensive, four-year secondary school with approximately 800 students.

GPA and Rank

Grade point average (GPA) and class rank are based on grades earned in courses for which high school credit has been awarded. Advanced placement, dual-enrollment, and Governor's School coursework are weighted an additional 1.0 quality point per credit. Honors courses are weighted an additional 0.5 quality points per credit. High school credits earned prior to grade nine are counted toward graduation requirements, but are not calculated in the cumulative GPA or used to determine class rank.

Curriculum

Staunton High School offers a comprehensive program for all students in grades 9-12. The program of study includes courses in advanced placement, honors, vocational/technical, special education, dual enrollment, online, and alternative education. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in many subject areas. Honors courses are offered in all core subject areas. Dual-enrollment (DE) classes are offered in conjunction with Blue Ridge Community College. The Shenandoah Valley Governor's School (SVGS) for Math, Science, and Technology and the Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities are offered to junior and senior applicants. The Valley Career and Technical Center is offered for sophomores, juniors and seniors.

Social Studies: AP Government, AP US History, DE US History, AP Psychology, AP World History
