Lee to Welcome New Athletic Trainer

STAUNTON, VA – Robert E. Lee High School’s long-serving athletic trainer, Daniel Kegerreis, has announced his retirement effective June 30, after 15 years of service to the school division. Kwadwo Donkor will take over to begin the 2017-2018 school year, as only the second person named to fill this position in Staunton City Schools.

The athletic training position was originally added to the school division budget for the 2002-2003 school year. Mr. Kegerreis was the first to fill this position for the high school and has been an asset to the school’s athletic programs during his 15-year tenure. “We greatly appreciate Mr. Kegerreis’ service and dedication to this position and his outstanding efforts in developing this position to best serve the needs of our student athletes,” shared Dr. Linda Reviea, Superintendent.

Mr. Donkor brings with him a variety of experience garnered through his current position as Head Athletic Trainer at Fishburne Military School in Waynesboro, as well as through his service as the Athletic Trainer for Staunton Braves Valley Baseball, his work with the Virginia Athletic Training Association’s Secondary School Committee, and the assistance he has provided at various sports and training camps, etc. Donkor shared, “I am very excited for this opportunity and am looking forward to the challenges this new position will offer. I will certainly bring my best effort in meeting the high standards and expectations set by Staunton City Schools.”

Dr. Reviea added, “The athletic trainer plays an integral role in the high school athletic programs, with duties ranging from injury prevention programs to emergency care for athletic injuries, and much more. We are pleased to welcome Mr. Donkor to our SCS team and are confident that his experience will help to make for a smooth transition as he assumes his duties at Lee next school year.”
